REGIONAL STORIES KIOSK GUIDELINES

Options:

- long quote from letter or diary – with just a line about the person e.g. Bill Beaudoin
- short quote/s – as illustration of person's character or with explanation of incident e.g. Alice Mitchell
- excerpt from their service record
- recommendation for award, letter from family
- synopsis of war service
- one or two incidents of war service.

Your story will be edited to 150-200 words maximum.

Individual, Group or Object	
Full Name	
Occupation on enlistment/outbreak of war (if known)	
Age on enlistment/outbreak of war (if known)	
Locality – must be Victorian	
Main locality – primarily related to this person. Could be their place of birth, where they were living pre-war/post war.	
Secondary localities (optional) – up to two further locations connected to this person. e.g. Alan Betteridge born Sth Aust but trained at Point Cook (primary location), descendants live in Melbourne(secondary location) e.g. Arch Glen was living in Walpeup (primary location), he was born in Camperdown – (secondary location), his descendants live in Morwell (secondary location)	
Service number	
Rank – highest achieved	
Awards and honours e.g. Military Medal, Distinguished Service Order, Royal Red Cross, KCMG, VD,	
Date enlisted – date enlistee took the oath not the date of joining the battalion – usually 2 nd page of service record	
Unit e.g. 21 st Battalion, 6 th Field Ambulance, Australian Motor Transport Group, Royal Australian Navy, 1 Squadron Aust Flying Corps	
Outcome	Date:
Returned to Australia	
Killed in Action	
Died of Wounds	
Died of Illness	
Return Notes e.g. person may have returned to Australia but died of war related illness in 1934.	

Images

Generally would use 1-3 images depending on story.

Can be up to 5 for a family story.

- Family Portrait in uniform
- Family Portrait pre/post war
- Image of diary or letter
- AWM action image
- Page from NAA service record
e.g. gallantry award, letter from family

Resolution

- 130-300dpi but can be as low as 72dpi (as per AWM) provided size is sufficient
 - ideal for kiosk is 1080x1080 but as low as 300 x 500 OK
 - thumbnails are too small
